2024 PCMS Hunting Report



2024 Executive Summary

- PCMS received normal snows from mid-January thru mid-February of 2024 and the winter moisture was enough to start spring growth. However, the installation received no summer monsoonal moisture and remained dry through until mid-October. By September, almost every dirt tank at PCMS was completely dry and the only available water to be found was via springs, solar pumps and water pipeline systems. An area wide rain event in mid-October provided 2-3 inches of much needed precipitation across the PCMS and partially filled some of the dirt tanks in Training Areas (TAs) 1 & 2, TA 7A, TA 16 and the Small Arms Range.
- Spring turkey season was open during April 2024. The hunt took place on weekends (Friday-Sunday) and several hunters were successful. There isn't much demand for spring turkey hunting and the weekend only schedule appears to be adequate to accommodate the low number of hunters.
- Beginning in fall 2024, PCMS switched to a Friday, Saturday and Sunday schedule for recreation. This was done primarily to reduce conflicts between military training, training range maintenance, biological and cultural survey work, range reseeding and rehabilitation programs, prescribed burning, etc., during the work week. As a result, nearly 100% of PCMS was always open for recreation during the long weekend with no TA closures. PCMS was also open during the week of Thanksgiving as well as from Dec. 20, 2023 Jan. 2, 2024. Although it is a reduction in the number of hunting days from previous years, this still equates to more hunting days than what was offered prior to 2014 when PCMS staffed a hunting desk for a few select hunts during the hunting season.
- Since phone checkin/out was implemented in October of 2022, the kiosk was rarely used and finally retired prior to the beginning of the 2024 hunting season. Recreation checkin/out in 2024 was exclusively by phone, computer or tablet. Previously, recreationists were allowed to check in via phone, computer or kiosk, but were required to check out via kiosk only. This has streamlined the check in/out process and alleviates the need to return to the hunter check station at the PCMS entrance to change TAs. However, the TA checkin system at PCMS is still universally disliked based on comments left in iSportsman and in the hunter survey. Much of this stems from poor cell coverage across PCMS which results in more time spent trying to find a signal and less time spent recreating (hunting).
- PCMS opened for recreation on Sept. 20, 2024 prior to the pronghorn muzzleloader season. In late August and early September there was a large-scale military training exercise that prevented it from being open earlier.

- Prolonged drought and the military training exercises conducted just prior to the pronghorn seasons likely had an impact on the pronghorn population at PCMS, which was reflected by the low harvest numbers.
- Only four bulls were harvested during the second over the counter (OTC) rifle
 bull elk hunt. This was likely due to the fact that PCMS had been extremely dry
 just until prior to the start of the hunt when a storm dumped 2-3 inches of rainfall
 across the property in mid-October. Many of the elk (and other big game) had
 likely left the property due to the lack of available water. Additionally, during
 much of the hunt the daily temperatures were above average and dry. The large
 rainfall event prior to the hunt did little to refill many of the ponds as the majority
 of it soaked into the soil.
- An extreme snowfall event (2-3 feet in early November forced the closure of PCMS (and Fort Carson) to recreation by the Garrison Commander. This largely impacted the third season OTC rifle bull elk hunt during its opening weekend and Veterans Day holiday (Nov. 11, 2024). Only the last day of the season was available for hunting and there was only one hunter. No bulls were taken during the third season OTC.
- During the fourth season bull elk hunt, the daily temperatures were in the mid-60s and caused a melt of the extreme snowfall event from two weeks prior. As a result, the roads [main supply routes MSR's) and two tracks] became saturated and resulted in road closures after the first day. All two tracks were closed and some MSRs. This limited the ability of hunters to access some areas of the PCMS. However, there were still four bulls taken during the season.
- The late November archery deer season and early December rifle deer season were slow due to the continued meltting of the snow. Many of the two tracks remained closed and much of the hunting was walk-in access only. No archery deer were taken between Oct.1 and Nov. 30, 2024, while only six bucks and two does were taken during the December rifle deer season. One archery buck was finally taken in late December.
- Harvest numbers remained steady for bighorn sheep (BH) with a 75% success rate among the four hunters. Limited accessibility at the beginning of December due to the melting snows likely contributed to the difficulty of getting into the canyons where the sheep are. The Boone & Crockett (B&C) average for the three sheep this year was 143 1/8. This was 10 points below the 13-year average of BH sheep B&C scores.
- In 2024, October was the busiest month of the year based on number of downrange passes issued. October includes the pronghorn rifle season, deer

archery and muzzleloader seasons and the beginning of the cow and bull elk rifle seasons. Deep snow in November closed PCMS for at least a week and then many areas were still inaccessible into early December.

- The number of total downrange passes issued for calendar year (January-December) 2024 was about 36% less than the all-time high of 2023. This is likely due to the snow closure in early November and the limited accessibility later in the month from the melting snow. A total of 2,400 downrange passes were issued during the calendar year. This is approximately 14% more than the 10-year average (2015-2024).
- The total number of individual recreationists at PCMS in 2024 was 326 while the average number of recreationists per year during the time period of 2016-2024 was 373.
- Of the hunters at PCMS, 91% were civilians and the other 9% were active duty.
 The majority of the hunters, 80%, were from Colorado with 26% from the
 Colorado Springs area,12% from the Denver-Fort Collins area, 10% from the
 Pueblo area, 8% from Las Animas and Huerfano counties, 6% from Trinidad and
 5% from the La Junta area.

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- All Boone and Crockett (B&C) data were collected by the individual hunter, not PCMS biologists. Therefore, B&C scores are subject to variation. All B&C scores and calculations are reviewed by PCMS biologists and the calculations are corrected when necessary.
- All B&C numbers used in this report are derived from the gross scores and not the final
 (adjusted) scores. Final scores are usually lower than gross scores because points are
 deducted for asymmetry in the final score. The exception to this is when scoring an atypical
 animal. When considering management options, the PCMS biologists focus more on overall
 size rather than symmetry.
- The average was calculated using all the acceptable B&C scores. For elk, spike animals were not included. This year 100% of hunters turned in their B&C data.
- This report was prepared solely to share hunting data collected on PCMS and not to provide any statistical analysis. Statistical analysis was not performed because the sample sizes (n) were generally too small, and there was too great a degree of variation in the data collection method to provide accurate statistical analysis.
- Calendar Year is Jan 1 Dec 31
- Hunt Year is Apr 1 Mar 31
